Administration Report:

Trustee Report:

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CURRICULUM

Curricular Services held curriculum implementation professional development sessions over the summer for teachers who are implementing K-3 English Language Arts and Literature and Mathematics as well as K-6 Physical Education and Wellness. Sessions were well attended and well received by eligible teachers. Many thanks to those who devoted their time on their summer break to this important learning.

Alberta School Boards Association Zone 2/3 hosted trustee engagement events in 2021/22 to deliberate governance considerations as school divisions prepared new curriculum implementation plans, and a comprehensive report was prepared for sharing with member division administrations. Similar events will likely be held this fall to provide input and share information on how rollout is progressing.

In response to the Minister of Education's May 17 announcement that updated draft curriculum can commence piloting in September 2022 for Science, French First Language and Literature, and French Immersion Language Arts and Literature, some teachers are participating in the pilot.

MEETING WITH MINISTER OF EDUCATION

On September 13, trustees and senior administration met with Minister LaGrange for a short opportunity that was offered to all school divisions. Priority topics presented to the Minister included the urgent need for high school space that can be met through an unsolicited P3 project in Erin Ridge North; meeting the mandated reserve cap by August 31, 2023; and the challenges of working within the weighted moving average education funding framework.

OTHER

An inaugural professional development institute was held over the summer for educational assistants. It was well received and appreciated by those in attendance. The division would like to continue and build upon the event if resources permit.

The division is hosting thought leaders for special projects in the division who will form the focus of the October 7 professional development topics. These include Dr. Dustin Louie at Sir Alexander MacKenzie focusing on Indigenous education, Sandra Herbst at Lorne Akins focusing on assessment, and Tina Faiz at Elmer S. Gish focusing on antiracism.

The division received positive feedback on hosting summer school solely at the Bellerose campus.

All 5 trustees are participating this year in a School Trustee Governance Program pilot cohort that is a partnership between the Alberta School Boards Association and the University of Calgary.

- Q: Lara asked if the school has a mascot. A: Not yet. Grand Rapids Hockey Team has a Griffin

 copy.
- Q: Why do only French-Immersion students get to attend Hockey Academy? A: Because W.D. Cuts offers it in English.
- Q: Why is the outdoor program lacking? A: Also a program offered at W.D.Cuts. Our school population is at an optimal level and Randy would prefer to not add and create overpopulation.
- Q: Does our school require students to bring their own technology? A: Not required but suggested.
- Q: Why is the climbing wall not used? A: Structurally sound and new ropes and harnesses
 have recently been purchased. Unfortunately, we do not have a staff member that is
 certified to operate.
- Q: Michelle asked Kristi about plans for the French Immersion Junior High. A: Kristi will investigate. There are 2 school sites in Riverside that Kristi is aware of, but no plans as of right now.
